## **OPALISED PEARLS FOUND IN SPOIL HEAP**

In a world first, two opalised pearls have recently been unearthed in the Coober Pedy opal fields of South Australia.



The world's first recorded opalised pearls were recently discovered in a Coober Pedy spoil heap

The two fourmillimetre specimens, dating back 65 million years, were uncovered by two opal Dale miners. Price and Tanja Burk. who were sorting through a spoil heap.

According to the *ABC News* story, Dr Ben Grguric from the SA Museum, said that "opals formed when seas dried up and alkaline soil dissolved the silica in certain rocks, as well as bones and shells." He says that "a lot of the opal fossils, including bones and shells, were formed during the cretaceous period, which was an era earlier than 65 million years ago and the age of the dinosaurs."

Dr Grguric informed *ABC News* that the opals were sent to the Australian Nuclear Science and Technology Organisation at Lucas Heights in Sydney, where they were scanned by a neutron imaging instrument, with the results indicating the typically concentric structure consistent with pearls.

The pearls are currently on display for a short time only at the South Australian Museum in Adelaide.

I love looking through Club magazines and commercial magazines - recent and from long ago. I learn so much of how things were done and how they are now done. There has been so much improvement in technology, so much experimentation in techniques and materials that they have also progressed way past what early lapidaries did and knew.

At the same time as I see all these new ways, I cannot help but laugh at the same complaints over all the years. Firstly, grinding wheels are damaged because people cannot get the hang of using the whole width of the wheel; then that sanding discs are torn because too much pressure was used, a mess is left for someone else to clean up, slabs are cut too thin for good cabbing, etc.

I also now see little of people taking time to undertake the type of projects that take a long time – projects such mosaics and intarsia. Yes, I know some people do, some carvers for example put many, many hours into their work, but the people who do take this time are few and far between. There is great satisfaction in doing these types of projects and they usually attract lots of attention and admiration.

Something else I see is fewer lapidary suppliers/shops as the years go by. I guess these business are not profitable enough these days, especially since so many people purchase their requirements on-line, directly from the kind of places the shopkeepers used to deal with.

The competition between lapidaries from across the State, and often other States too, will inspire new and older members to try a new aspect of this great hobby.

## **JUDGING GEMBOREE 2016**

While the 2016 GEMBOREE is being held in Tasmania at Ulverstone, the judging of 550 of the entries took place over two weekends in New South Wales. This was because of a lack of qualified judges available in Tasmania. Although this was a big task it was also good practice and experience for the NSW judges who will have to do it all again for the NSW GEMKHANA in October this year and then for the 2017 GEMBOREE run by the NSW Gem and Lapidary Council at Lithgow.

A total of 706 entries were received for the GEMBOREE at Ulverstone, which, given the declining numbers being entered into competitions in recent years is a good number. The 150 odd to be judged at Ulverstone are predominantly made up of minerals and fossils.

After looking at the number of entries it was decided that it would be advantageous to all concerned to try and complete the judging in two long days, rather than spread it over four shorter days. This saved a lot of travelling and time for all concerned. It also gave everyone the next day, Sunday, to recuperate from their efforts!

The judging in Sydney took place at two locations. The first was on the Saturday 30th January in the clubrooms of the Parramatta-Holroyd Lapidary Club. This involved a total of 33 people, made of 14 judges plus 'scribes', catering staff and others manipulating the calculators who spent one very long, but satisfactory day completing all of their allocated tasks. The day finished with a 'bang' as a quite savage storm hit the area, with lightning and thunder directly overhead, resulting in flickering lights and startled gasps from people as we beavered away in the semi-dark trying to finish off work before we had what seemed like an inevitable blackout. Fortunately, this did not occur.

The second round of judging was another long day on the following Saturday the 6th February in the clubrooms of the Central Coast Lapidary Club at Ourimbah. Another 29 people, comprising of 10 different judges and 'scribes', number crunches with their calculators, and catering staff spent another long, but equally satisfactory day, and finished off all the remaining work.

So, from me to everyone who gave of their time and efforts for these two judging days, please accept my gratitude and a heartfelt 'thank you'. I would also hope that the experience and knowledge gained by participating in this exercise ultimately assists you in a small way in your own endeavours in the various crafts.

I also know that the organisers of the Tasmania GEMBOREE greatly appreciate the efforts and assistance all of you have given them by participating in these two days of judging. Thank you all once again.
