

ACCOMMODATION AT LITHGOW AND SURROUNDING AREAS

There are a variety of accommodation styles available to you within the Lithgow City area, from B&B, Hotel/Motel, cabins to caravan parks.



You are advised that this event, over Easter 2017, is in conjunction with the NSW school holidays and therefore the majority of accommodation will be booked very early and advice from the Lake Lyell Recreation Area is that 60% of their sites have been booked already. Some facilities however will not accept bookings until the new year and you would need to be quick to confirm.

There are many alternate Towns and Historic Villages within 30 to 50 minutes out from Lithgow that have satisfactory accommodation to suit your needs and a chance to explore the beautiful Blue Mountains region of NSW.

Some suggestions would be to travel back east approximately 35 mins to Blackheath or Katoomba, or further west to Wallerawang, Kelso and Portland or onto Bathurst and many small villages in between. Information on any of these areas would be available from the Visitor Information Centre.

There are a limited number of powered and un-powered sites available within the Showground, however with any of the accommodation on offer, BOOK EARLY to avoid disappointment.

GEMBOREE STATS 2016

Of the 106 competitors that entered into the Competition at the Ulverstone GEMBOREE, 47 of them were from NSW. That meant there were 15 NSW clubs involved with this competition. They were: Bankstown, Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Cessnock, Goulburn, Grafton, Illawarra, Inverell, Lismore, Northern Districts, Orange, Parramatta/Holroyd, Port Hacking, Tamworth, and Western Suburbs.

Some of these Clubs had only one competitor entering and it is hoped that this will mean a greater competitive spirit within the Clubs for future competitions.

A great effort by the Clubs of New South Wales – well done!

INDIGENOUS ARTEFACTS FOUND

During construction of the south-east light rail line for Sydney, contractors unearthed around 20 000 Indigenous artefacts over a 100-square-metre area near the corner of Alison Road and Doncaster Road in Randwick. Elders have said that this site is a unique heritage area of high significance, and have called on the Federal Government to intervene and ensure it is properly assessed. The site was being destroyed to build a carriage stabling yard for the light rail.

According to the ABC, "Darug Elder Uncle Des Dyer visited the site and said the artefacts included spear heads and cutting tools, some of which appeared to show trade and contact with Indigenous people in the Hunter Valley... And on our songlines one group would come down to us and they'd bring their stones and tools with them to swap and we'd give them ours and they'd take it back to wherever they came from". Mr Dyer said he'd like to see construction stopped "and the area classed as an Aboriginal heritage area".

The rail line needs a serious rethink as it is an affront to Indigenous peoples' cultural heritage. Murri author, Ken Canning, told ABC, "We can learn so much from these

sites, it's unique opportunity to think more about land usage... our people have lost enough through construction, these things are very, very traumatic". According to the ABC, an application been lodged behalf of local elders and clans asking for an end to the construction, so a proper assessment of the site, under sections nine and 10 of the Federal

Aboriginal Heritage Protection Act, could be carried out."

Associate Professor of Aboriginal History at University of Technology Sydney, Professor Norman, told the ABC, "We can learn so much from these sites, it's a unique opportunity to think more about land usage, patterns of migration and as we think more about environmental change, what kind of knowledge is available to us by looking closely at these sites."
