#### WORLD'S LONGEST VOLCANIC CHAIN

The world's longest continental hotspot track has been discovered in eastern Australia by scientists researching volcanic hotspots. Through evidence of volcanism and magma composition, the scientists determined the volcanic chain was formed ancient continental movement Australia shifted northwards over a hotspot in the Earth's mantle. The mantle plume is thought to be still in existence under the sea in Tasmania's northwest in a region that coincides with recent seismic activity. The team of scientists have named the 2000kilometre long hotspot trail, the 'Cosgrove Track' after an extinct Victorian volcano.

The Cosgrove Track was formed by a mantle plume between 33 million years and 9 million years ago. Volcanic activity forms where the mantle plume rises close enough to the surface to melt Earth's solid outer layer (the lithosphere) into magma. The team of scientists found that "lithospheric



thickness has a dominant influence on the volume and chemical composition of plume-derived magmas... Trace-element concentrations from samples along this track support the notion that these compositional variations result from different degrees of partial melting, which is controlled by the thickness of overlying lithosphere" (*Nature*). "The plume created volcanic activity only where Earth's solid outer layer, called the lithosphere, is thinner than 130 kilometres" (ANU).

The concept of mantle plumes was hypothesised by a geophysicist in 1971, and the convection force of mantle plumes are said to be independent of plate tectonics (Wikipedia). Geochemistry is a fascinating field.

#### How the G&L Council works

All lapidary clubs in the State are invited to join the Council and send a representative (delegate) to Council meetings, which are held monthly, to participate in discussions and decision-making. Of course, it is difficult for clubs outside the metropolitan area to do this, but many metropolitan clubs don't send a representative either.



From the delegates – that is, representatives

from the clubs – at the AGM (held in December), one of their number is elected as President, Secretary, Treasurer, and so on. Not all delegates are elected into a position, but then some positions are appointments, such as the Editor, and are not necessarily a delegate of their club. Any, and all, club members, even if not a delegate of their club, may attend meetings, and will always be welcomed. Visitors may not vote, but are welcome to join all discussions.

The Gem & Lapidary Council cannot and does not tell clubs how they should be run.

The Council attends to matters that clubs, one by one, would find difficult, such as dealing with government departments, in particular regarding fossicking sites and problems arising from misconduct that could restrict fossicking for all of us. Sometimes, clubs are asked to send a letter or petition to reinforce the Council's efforts – very few clubs manage to so.

The Council has been able to arrange various insurance cover at very competitive cost and, recently, has arranged public risk insurance your club can avail themselves of, also at competitive rates, when other community groups have had insurmountable problems causing them to close down or cancel events. All types of policy arranged by the Council are through the broker, Webster Hyde Heath. WHH sometimes changes insurers, always gaining us the best deal possible.

The Council organises GEMKHANAs and GEMBOREEs to promote our hobby/ art. The delegates, alone, cannot do all the work involved in these events, and need members (ie member clubs AND their members) to do some of the tasks that make these events the success they always are – financially, we

hope, but also in terms of bringing people of like-minds together.

Of course, the more people who are willing to do something, however small, the less each person has to do.

Council has very few ways of raising money to attend to the work it does on behalf of us all. As you can imagine, membership fees (at present \$70, due on Jan 1) don't go very far. GEMKHANAs and GEMBOREEs cost a lot of money to stage, often for little return.

The Council can arrange tutorials (1 or 2 day workshops) in many aspects of lapidary.

The Council also provides judges for club competitions, GEMKHANAs and GEMBOREEs. It circulates news about the clubs and their events, and all sorts of other news, through the *Gem & Lapidary News* and on its website: gemlapidarycouncilnsw.org.au

AFLACA (Australian Federation of Lapidary & Allied Crafts Associations Inc ) is the national lapidary body, and operates in a similar fashion to the Council. We are all members of AFLACA, too. The executive of AFLACA are delegates appointed by each of the State bodies.

Our G&L Council, and AFLACA, have done a wonderful job in keeping clubs and their members in contact with one another – the family of lapidary is all the stronger for their existence.

How can you help?

Make notices from the Council available to all your members. Send items of interest to the editor for the *G&L News* and make each issue available for members to read. Become a judge. Just one day, now again, to help on an outside promotion, would help. Perhaps you would make a raffle prize for the GEMKHANA or GEMBOREE.

Whatever you do, by being an active member, you will reap more than you sow.

Clubs should keep in mind that any Club that assists with the practical running/organising of the GEMBOREE will be allowed FREE tailgating space at the GEMBOREE for the duration of the event.

Keep in mind that material sold at the free tailgating stall MUST be Club material -that is, it is not to be owned by an individual. It is aimed to benefit the Club as a whole.
