LAPIDARY THEFT IN WAGGA WAGGA

Most of you will be familiar with the work of Lou Karas of the Wagga Wagga Lapidary Club. Some time last month, thieves broke into his house and took everything that Lou has produced over his long career in Lapidary, including facetted topaz, sapphires, garnets, rubies, spinel, opal, quartz, and every type of cabbed stone imaginable. Hundreds of items were stolen along with a quantity of unmelted silver. The thieves took meticulous care in removing glass panels from his display cases to get at the stones. As you can imagine, Lou is completely gutted. Police are investigating. Please be on the lookout for anyone offering large or small quantities of quality lapidary material for sale or mounting. If you have any information about this theft, please contact the Police.

AUSTRALIA'S OLDEST JEWELLERY

An Indigenous piece of jewellery, unearthed in the Kimberly region of northern Australia, has been recognised the 'earliest hard evidence that Australia's first inhabitants were using bone to make tools and ornaments.'

The bone was dug up at Carpenter's Gap, a large rock shelter in Windjana Gorge National



Park. Historically, 'the area is of great cultural importance to the local Bunuba people who once lived there, and was the base for Jandamurra, the Indigenous outlaw who led an armed rebellion against European settlers in the 1890s.'

According to the ANU (Australian National University), 'the ornament, a pointed kangaroo bone worn through the nose, has been dated at more than 46,000-years-old.'
