COMPETITION "REMINDERS"

COMPETITORS:

Firstly, enjoy your cutting and/or production of your special items. However, if you wish to compete and improve your standards, please ensure that you check the relevant Schedule for the competition to ensure:

- a] that there is suitable section for your work
- that you meet all the requirements listed in any Special Conditions and the Competitor & Judging Manual, Issue No. 8, April 2015 re size and material
- c] that you enter the correct division and level.

As a competitor – particularly when you are new to competitions – talk to your instructor for advice so as to avoid problems and disappointments.

COMPETITION COMMITTEES:

Firstly, if asking for Gem Council Judges to assess your competition entries, please ensure that your schedule meets the requirements of the Judging & Rules Manual.

At Level 1 [club level] only — if you wish to hold a competition that is not covered by the Competitor & Judging Manual, Issue No. 8, April 2015, and wish Gem & Lapidary Council Judges to assess the entries, you will need to provide suitable Judging Sheets and Criteria under which the entries are to be judges. These are to be submitted at the same time as you request Judges.

It is recommended that the Competition Committee comprise of people who understand the Competitor & Judging Manual, and can advise competitors on the correct section[s] they should enter, and if their entry is eligible according to the schedule under which they are competing.

JUDGES:

Please take some time before you start to judge the section you have been given and read:

- a] the schedule to check the requirements of that section
- b] the Competitor & Judging Manual, Issue No. 8, April 2015 to check any definitions and size requirements

The most common error that has been noted recently is with the categorising/differentiating between Free Forms and Fancy cabochons - particularly where "ridges" are concerned. Please take care with these sections because "ridges" are allowed for Free Forms but NOT for Fancy cabochons.

Another error that has been noted is where entries have been placed in incorrect sections e.g. Wire Wrapped Jewellery being entered and judged as Metalcraft.

Please look at each entry you have been given before you judge it, and if you have any concerns raise it with the Competition Committee.

NSW GEMKHANA 2018

We should have known that this was going to be an interesting few days. It was raining quite heavily as we packed the caravan to leave home, but then the rain stopped allowing us to get out on to the road dry. We then settled in and made our way out to the M1, where it started to bucket down once again. However, all was going well and we were dry. We were also asked to camp in a different area to that which is normally allocated to us. This was further away from the airfield and the train station, so we experienced a lot less noise. We were also closer to the hall, which made our work a lot easier.
