New South Wales GEMKHANA – 2019 Sat 28th & Sun 29th September

This was the most successful show we have ever had, which resulted from a number of major changes to our past processes.

The NSW GEMKHANA has, in the past, been held in October over the long weekend, a three day event. However, last year [2018] public attendance was poor. This resulted in a major rethink of what the NSW Gem & Lapidary Council should do to remedy that situation, which was not "pleasant" for all concerned. To assist the Council in making changes, participants were asked for constructive suggestions, which they believed would improve the overall occasion.

One of the major suggestions/changes was to NOT hold the GEMKHANA on the long weekend because it was in the middle of school holidays and there were too many other major competing events on that same weekend, which had the potential to reduce the public attendance.

Fortunately, the weekend before the long weekend was available, which fitted with another suggestion, which was to make it a two day event, that did not coincide with any other gem shows.

Publicity – both multi-media and traditional forms – were also increased, with good results.

Clubs were granted a free table space inside the hall, where their goods could be sold. A total of seven clubs took advantage of this facility, which resulted in many more club members from those clubs actually attending the GEMKHANA – many for the first time.

The Council also had many more volunteers from the various clubs to assist with the setting up and dismantling of the GEMKHANA, which was very good to see. A big "thank you" goes to all those people as there is a lot of work involved and many hands help to make it easier. An increased number at Happy Hours was also great and enjoyed by all.

Upon completion, a diploma member may use the postnominals, FGAA, Fellow of the Gemmological Association of Australia.
