#### "G" is for Garnet

Garnet has been used as a gemstone for over 5000 years. It has been found in the jewellery of many Egyptian burials and was the most popular gemstone of Ancient Rome. It is a beautiful gem that is usually sold without treatment of any kind. The opaque garnets have been used as an abrasive since the Bronze age.

Garnet is not a single mineral, but describes a group of several closely related minerals. Garnets come in a variety of colours and have many different varieties. However, the most widely-known colour of Garnet gemstones is dark red.

Garnet comes in almost every colour of the rainbow. While red is the most common, pink, yellow, brown, almost black can be found, and you can find more rare Garnets in orange, green and even alexandrite-like colour changing Garnets. Colourless also exists but is rarely seen. Blue Garnet is named for a dominant hue rarely seen in Garnets, Blue Garnet is an incredibly rare, undeniably beautiful, and an extremely unusual variety of colour-change Umbalite Garnet.. Blue Garnets were unheard of until spring 2011 when they were found in Africa. In a certain light, they do change colour

Garnets are often found in mica schists. They are also commonly found in black sands when panning in gold mining districts. Anthills are also good places to search for Garnet. Garnet is also found in the rocks of contact metamorphism, subsurface magma chambers, lava flows, deep-source volcanic eruptions, and the soils and sediments...

Garnet, in various forms, can be found in many sites throughout Australia. Two of the most prolific sites are the Harts Range area in the Northern Territory and Fullarton River in Queensland. Found mainly in small sizes, tsavorites over 2 carats are very rare. Prices range from \$500 a carat for good colours with some inclusions. to \$2,000 to \$7,000 for clean larger stones with top colour. [Tsavorite]

Garnet ranges in colour from bright yellowish green to deep green or bluish green]. Demantoid Garnet is the rarest and most valuable of the Garnets and is one of the rarest of all coloured gemstones. Demantoid can have a green colour that rivals emerald and a fire that exceeds diamond.

Garnet is the birthstone for January. Garnet is said to be a lucky stone for love, success, and for business relationships. It is the stone of those born under the zodiac sign of Aquarius, and as an enhancer, strengthener crystal it has been worn for centuries as a protective and powerful talisman.
