"M" is for Malachite

Malachite is a copper carbonate hydroxide mineral, and most often forms in fractures and deep underground spaces where the water table and hydrothermal fluids provide the means for chemical precipitation.

The mineral was given this name due to its resemblance to the leaves of the Mallow plant.

Malachite was extensively mined at the Great Orme mines in Britain 3,800 years ago, using stone and bone tools. Archaeological evidence indicates that mining activity ended c. 600 BCE, with up to 1,760 tonnes of copper being produced from the mined **Malachite**. Archaeological evidence indicates that the mineral has been mined and smelted to obtain copper at Timna Valley in Israel for more than 3,000 years. Since then, **Malachite** has been used as both an ornamental stone and as a gemstone. **Malachite** is typically associated with copper deposits around limestone.

Malachite is found in many deposits worldwide including at Broken Hill in Australia and the Ok Tedi mine in PNG.

While **Malachite** gemstones are renowned for their rich green colour, there is also a gemstone known as *red malachite* that is just as loved for its warm terra cotta colour. Green **Malachite** has been valued since antiquity, especially in Egyptian culture as far back as 4000 BC for creating amulets and statues, lining pharaoh headdresses and even as pigment for makeup. *Red malachite* is actually only fancy name for a type of jasper with banding that closely resembles the banded patterns found in natural green **Malachite**. Various forms of jasper were also loved by the Egyptians for use as amulets.

The high copper content of **Malachite** (57%), makes the dust toxic. This can make it dangerous to mine, cut, or hand-polish without proper protective equipment. Luckily, it is completely safe to handle rough and polished specimens.

Synthetic **Malachite** has been produced and used to make jewellery and small sculptures. Poorly done synthetics are often recognized by their unnatural colour. The better synthetics can usually be recognized because their banding and eyes do not have a natural botryoidal shape. An experienced person can identify most of the synthetic and man-made materials on sight.

Malachite is said to be a stone of balance, abundance, manifestation and intention. It is also said to absorb energy and draw emotions to the surface. It apparently clears and activates all Chakras, and is especially helpful in the stimulation of the Heart and Throat Chakras.
