"Q" is for Quartz

Pure Quartz, which is also known as Rock Crystal, is colourless. Various impurities are responsible for the extensive range of colours. The main crystalline **Quartz** varieties used as gemstones are described below.

Amethyst

Amethyst-, the purple variety, is the most popular and valuable **Quartz** gemstone.

Amethyst ranges from light to dark purple.

Citrine

Citrine is the yellow, orange, or reddish-brown variety of **Quartz**. It is usually coloured by heat treatment of Amethyst or Smoky Quartz. Light yellow or lemon yellow Citrine is often called Lemon **Quartz** in the gem trade.

Smoky Quartz

Smoky **Quartz** is the brown smoky variety of **Quartz**. It ranges in colour from light brown to black. Despite its dark colour, it is rarely opaque

Rose Quartz

The rosy pink variety of **Quartz** is known as Rose **Quartz**, and its colour is usually soft, ranging from very light pink to medium pink in intensity. Rose **Quartz** is often milky or hazy, and it may lack good transparency.

Rock Crystal

The colourless, transparent variety of **Quartz**, free of any impurities is known as "Rock Crystal". Flawless and very large cuts may be cut from Rock Crystal.

Milky Quartz

Milky **Quart**z is the white, translucent to opaque variety of **Quartz**. Though very common in nature, it is not often used as a gemstone.

Rutilated Quartz

Colourless **Quartz** with golden yellow rutile inclusions as hairlike growths within the gemstone, are known as Rutilated **Quartz**.

Ametrine

Ametrine is an interesting, colour-zoned combination of purple Amethyst and brownish-yellow Citrine.

Prasiolite / Green Quartz

Prasiolite, or Green **Quartz**, describes a light green **Quartz** artificially coloured by heat treatment of certain types of Amethyst. It. may also be called Green Amethyst by some jewellers.

Blue Quartz

The blue variety of **Quartz**, which is uncommon in nature, is seldom used as a gemstone. Most Blue Quartz is clear Rock Crystal irradiated with gold to

form a deep sky blue colour. Blue **Quartz** may also refer to a dull greyishblue Quartz in massive form with Crocidolite inclusions.

Tourmalinated Quartz

Colourless **Quartz** with <u>Tourmaline inclusion</u>s, often as thin long black crystals, is known as "Tourmalinated **Quartz**".

Cat's Eye Quartz

Cat's Eye **Quartz** is **Quartz** with dense, tiny <u>Rutile inclusions</u> that cause a <u>cat's eye effect</u>. It is not common, and the <u>chatoyant</u> effect is usually weak.

Quartz is found all over Australia both as crystals and as fine-grained material. Rock crystal and smoky **quartz** are found in all states, while amethyst and citrine are less common.

Australia's most prolific sources of gem quality **quartz** has been Kingsgate, in north eastern NSW. This area abounded in rock crystal, smoky **quartz** and citrine in large, clear crystals up to 3 metres long.

Transparent Rock Crystal has many electronic uses; It is used as oscillators in radios, watches, and pressure gauges, and in the study of optics. **Quartz** is also used as an abrasive for sandblasting, grinding glass, and cutting soft stones.
