"S" is for Sapphire

Sapphire is one of the two gem-varieties of corundum - the other being ruby (defined as corundum in a shade of red). Although blue is the best-known **Sapphire** colour, they occur in other colours, including grey and black, and they can be colourless. A pinkish orange variety of Sapphire is called Padparadscha.

The most valuable colour of **Sapphire** is a **Cornflower Blue Sapphire** also often called a **Kashmire Sapphire**. Another extremely valuable **Sapphire** form is the very rare, orange-pink colour. An exotic type of **Sapphire**, known as **Colour Changing Sapphire** displays a different colour depending on its lighting. In natural light, **Colour Changing Sapphire** is blue, but in artificial light, it is violet. (This effect is the same phenomenon well-known in the gemstone Alexandrite). Yellow and pink Sapphire have recently become very popular, and are now often seen in jewellery.

Every **Sapphire** mine produces a wide range of quality, and origin is not a guarantee of quality. For **Sapphire**, Kashmir receives the highest premium, although Burma, Sri Lanka, and Madagascar also produce large quantities of fine quality gems. **Sapphires** in colours other than blue are called "fancy" or "parti-coloured" **Sapphires**.

Fancy **Sapphires** are often found in yellow, orange, green, brown, purple and violet hues.

Particoloured **Sapphires** are those stones which exhibit two or more colours within a single stone. Australia is the largest source of particoloured **Sapphires**; they are not commonly used in mainstream jewellery and remain relatively unknown. Particoloured **Sapphires** cannot be created synthetically and only occur naturally Colourless **Sapphires** have historically been used as diamond substitutes in jewellery.

In Australia, **Sapphire** is found in a number of east coast localities, from north Queensland to north-east Tasmania. The largest and most economic deposits are found in the New England area, New South Wales, around Inverell and Glen Innes, and in central Queensland, around Anakie and Rubyvale.

Gold mining efforts revealed the first instance of discovering **Sapphires** in Australia. In 1851, a report was issued of finding **Sapphires** during gold mining on the Cudgegong and Macquarie rivers in New South Wales. Other major discoveries followed in 1854 and 1875, pushing the development of a **Sapphire** mining industry further.

The typical Australian **Sapphire** is dark blue in colour with a strong green *dichroism*, and *colour zoning*. The most famous types of stones coming from Australia are parti-coloured. These stones contain a mix of green, blue, and yellow, Current information leading into 2020 shows Australian **Sapphires** account for over 70% of the global blue **Sapphire** production, and demand for them is only increasing. Global jewellery brands have turned to Australian **Sapphires** to meet their commercial needs
