"V" is for Varisite

Variscite is a hydrated aluminium Phosphate.

Variscite is an opaque gemstone with interesting colour splotches and veins. It is usually a light or minty-green with whitish patterns. While **Variscite** is relatively rare, it occurs in many localities across the globe, however almost all **Variscite** gemstones originate from Utah, and for this reason it may also be called Utahlite.

A significant **Variscite** discovery was made in 2003 in Western Australia by Glenn Archer and David Vaughan from the Australian Outback Mining company. This new deposit is producing an exciting range of colours, ranging from delicate lime greens to darker material close to the colour of top grade chrysoprase, and through to a deep translucent emerald green.

The most unusual feature of this **Variscite** is its association with gold. Gold is unevenly distributed in the **Variscite** specimens, and ranges from discrete fine grains, to visible concentrations in the **Variscite**. There are larger single grains of gold in the rock matrix. Assays of up to 17g/t Au have been returned from some samples.

Much of the this mined Variscite is also webbed. This is an added bonus as "spiderweb Variscite" is a highly sought after material for cutting cabochons'

People have created jewellery from **Variscites** since Neolithic times, more than 6,000 years ago. Neolithic beads carved from **Variscite** discovered in Brittany, France were called callaïs or callaina (callainite), after a gemstone described by the Classical Roman scholar Pliny the Elder. Although first believed to be turquoise from China, it became evident this material wasn't turquoise but **Variscite**. However, the name callaïs for these beads remains in use in art history and archeology. While not proof of Neolithic trade between Europe and China, researchers have determined that some of these **Variscites** came from Sarrabus on the island of Sardinia (Italy). Thus, these artefacts still point towards a large prehistoric gem trade network in Europe.

Variscite is said to be a stone with a lovely vibration that will kindle joyous feelings and bring peace and harmony to your heart. It is excellent to aid anyone with stress or anxiety.

It enhances life by generating feelings of inner peace, love and compassion. It helps you to find solutions to problems.

Obviously a great stone to have had during the Covid crisis!!

A trip to Mudgee to finalise some last minute details was held on Thursday 13 January. A total of eight Committee members attended. While some members stayed overnight, others were only there for the day. It was a very busy time with visits to the Honey Haven; the Council; the Information Centre; The police station; the Club Mudgee to obtain \$2.20 special membership application forms and of course a lot of time out at AREC Unfortunately, because of COVID, several other appointments had to be cancelled because they were no longer operating.
