My thanks go to everyone who participated, for their patience and enthusiasm along with their desire to learn a new skill.

Sue O'Neil (Secretary of Goulburn Club) has to take credit for her job which was to master the kiln and assist the members in getting their pieces fired. It was two very long days, but everyone was successful and happy in creating three pieces each.

Faceting and Cabbing Whilst Travelling

A number of years ago I purchased an old Agatemaster faceting machine from one of our Club auctions. As it was old and clunky and was in need of a bit of TLC no one else wanted it, so I was able to purchase it for the reserve price.

The main reason I was interested in it, was because it came with a 12 VDC motor which was controlled by a home built main to 12 VDC speed controller. The full set of 8 inch copper and type laps that it came with was another good reason to purchase it. It also took the same size dops as the Gemmasters at the Club and my old VJ that I had purchase many

years ago from a friend of my mothers.

As with most ideas it took a while to iron out some of the bugs. The first thing to do though was to clean it up and see if it still functioned accurately enough to use as a faceting machine and not just as a flat lap cabbing machine.

Most of the Agatematser is made from a cast

metal, and after cleaning the dust and accumulated grime from lack of use it came up pretty good. The stage for the mast was a mess, the old oil that was on it had attracted quite a lot of dust and turned it into a sticky mess. A clean with metho and light scraping with a Stanley knife blade brought it up OK, although it had some pitting on it, which I think some of this was left over from the casting and machining of the stage during manufacture.

The mast is steel and the mast base was cast material like the stage. The mast base was cleaned using the same method as for the stage and it also looked pitted like the stage. The steel mast had a small amount of surface rust on it which stopped the head unit from moving freely. I used a 1200 wet and dry with sewing machine oil to clean the rust off.



Next was the head unit and quill, I carefully strip it down enough so I could clean and lightly oil it (the quill is part or the head unit and cannot be removed like the Gemmaster quill). Once reassembled it seemed to function well and moved up and down the mast freely.

One thing with the head unit I did not like was the index wheel is held in place by a knurled nut with no form of key or locking mechanism to keep the index wheel in place. If this nut comes loose for any reason the index wheel would move thus putting your stone out of alignment to the index. The VJ is similar in that it has no key system either but at least it has three screws holding the wheel in place and it's unlikely that all three screws would come loose.



As I did not like the look of the home-made mains to 12VDC controller, I considered briefly in making a new one but opted to purchase a 12VDC variable controller from Ebay. This would allow me to run it from a 12VDC transformer which could be located well away from the water used when faceting or cabbing. This would also allow me to use it whist travelling even if we were without a mains power.

Now to see if it all works, first thing is to set up a current meter connected to a 12 V car battery, this would allow me to see how many amps it pulled at 12VDC, as this would determine the size of the transformer I would need.

All good under 3 amps even under load (that is I simulated a load as though I was cutting something) whilst varying the rotating speed of the master lap. This is great as I had a 3 amp transformer in my junk/parts box.

If I was to take this away travelling with me I needed to reduce its size and weight, especially the weight. The faceting machine was mounted on a large piece of laminated board with a substantial metal frame with legs under it and the motor attached to this frame at the rear of the board. This enabled the motor pulley to hang below the board so that the drive belt had clearance.

OK, no problem easy enough to remove the metal frame and reduce the size of the board. The two legs at the front I was able to keep as they were separate from the rest of the heavy frame. Two wooden legs from

from Bunnings, cut down to size for the rear legs would do fine.

Now to mount that motor, as the motor's pulley had to hang below the main board and line up with the master lap pulley, I had thoughts that I might have to reused some of that heavy frame. Well as luck would have it a double thickness of the board would put the motor pulley in line with the master lap pulley.

Of course, the motor's shaft was not long enough to go through two thickness of board, so by cutting a notch in the main board and mounting the motor on an off-cut of the board, then attaching it to the main board we were back in business. As the belt was round it was easy to make a new belt to fit and away, we go.

Although still bulky it easily weighs a third of what it did and is smaller by half. No, I do not take the 8 inch laps away just six inch (they are heavy enough).

Now you would not use it to cut competition stones but it helps to keep your hand in while travelling. It does quite well at faceting and cabbing, although cabbing on a flat surface does take some getting used to.
