## Bumblebee Jasper- Update

Thanks to readers' comments regarding last month's item on Bumblebee Jasper, it seems that sulphur in Bumblebee Jasper is not only toxic, but can contribute to tarnishing of silver jewellery settings. One member was disappointed when the gold-plated silver setting of her bumblebee jewellery started to tarnish, so she took it back to the gold plater, who couldn't explain the reason for it, so cleaned and plated the item again—only for the same tarnish to re-appear. Seems it was the sulphur leaking from the stone to the silver that was causing the problem.

So if you intend setting your Bumblebee stone in silver, consider ways to avoid the stone touching the setting or the wearer's skin. Maybe by stabilising the stone before cutting and polishing, or sealing with liquid glass/resin before setting it.

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#### **Cabbing on the Agatemaster**

Cabbing on the Agatemaster takes a little getting use to but it's really no different than cabbing on the normal vertical grinding wheels. You still dop the same as you would, which gives you better control especially on small stone or, as I prefer, by hand most of the time as I trend to do more free form cabs which can be essential when working some if not all forms of opal.

What do you use to form your cabs on you ask, I start with 100 or 240 grit metal lap that I use for ruffing in then move on to the other grits as you would normally do. Now you could use the laps that you use for faceting but you run the big risk of damaging them and making them unusable for faceting. Another reason not to use your metal lap to form your cabs, it is very, very hard not to end up with flat spots on your cabs, there's no give in metal, not like in your nova wheels.

You can buy pre-made soft laps or the parts to make your own, there are a variety of metal, plastic and wood master laps, some are magnetic allowing you to swap out different grid laps, polishing felt or leather disk on the one master.

Or you can make your own like my father use to do. A piece of Masonite (or similar water resistant/ proof material) cut to the correct lap size that you want, a piece of

foam flooring undelay or rubber matting (you can buy the rubber laps if you prefer) and either wet and dry emery paper, some ruff vinyl or canvas or purchase the diamond impregnated plastic disks. Armed with a tin of Shelly's contact adhesive or similar (I have used shoe sole repair glue, all that was available to me at the time and had success with it) and away you go sticking them all together making up various grit laps.

Each system has its draw backs, like having to replace the wet and dry

emery paper or the plastic diamond disk more often than the vinvl or canvas ones. But with vinyl or canvas laps you need to also have the various silicon carbide arit or diamond powders to keep the laps charged. The beauty about this method though, is you can either use the grits dry, with oil, water, as a paste like in faceting, in other words you control how much or how little grit/paste you use.

Once you have worked through your laps and have your cab ready for polish you have the choice of felt or leather laps or whatever material you would normally use, with whatever polishing product you prefer or you can use your flexi-shaft (e.g., Dremel) with the same material you would use on your laps.

You can also just rely on your flexi-shaft to do it all, but it can be harder to maintain your commercial shapes. Free form shapes are easier to do with your flexi-shaft, as it is retaining that thin layer of opal while working on the surrounding area, you cannot go past your flexi-shaft.

It all comes down to personal preference and to how much space you have and weight considerations when you are traveling around Australia.
