SCRIMSHAW CLASSES Parramatta—13th / 14th JANUARY 2024

Those club members who took advantage of the generous educational offer extended to the club by the Gem and Lapidary Council, gained enormous benefit from the knowledge expounded by the tutor Kathy Selwood.

The subject selected by the club was Scrimshaw. It is a technique of scribing lines onto the surface of whale bones and whale teeth, usually by the whalers in the mid 19th century.

When the chosen design was drawn, and lines scribed onto the surface, they were then blackened by rubbing into the grooves, soot obtained from the ships lanterns.

In the tutorial, bones were selected, sanded very smoothly. Various designs were then drawn on the surface. They were then scribed, polished, and then blackened.

Those who participated in the event, found it extremely worthwhile and beneficial.








Illawarra Cabbing Course


