

linear traces (fine, straight cracks) on one surface may be caused by cleavage planes intersecting that surface.

Not all crystalline materials show cleavage. But if cleavage does occur, then it indicates that the substance is indeed crystalline, and cannot be amorphous.

Because cleavage is a weakness in the structure, those substances showing it too the least extent, are really the most likely to be suitable for gemstones, e.g. garnets, guartz, spinel. Two exceptions are diamond and topaz in which the hardness compensates to a great extent for the cleavage.

Mineral Cleavage and Crystal Form





Difference Between Fracture and Cleavage





***Twinning:** twin crystal is a crystal consisting of two or more portions of the same mineral crystal which have grown in such a way that some crystallographic plane is common to the parts of the twin. There are two main types of twin crystal - contact twins or interpenetrant twins.


