Some Mineralogy and Gemmology Basics Continued FLUORESCENCE:


Fluorescence is a phenomenon that causes a mineral to "glow" within the visible spectrum when exposed to ultraviolet light. Minerals that exhibit fluorescence are known as "fluorescent minerals". Fluorescent minerals contain particles in their structure known as activators, which respond to ultraviolet light by giving off a visible glow.

Gemmologists use UVA of long-wave ultraviolet light or LWUV 365 nm and UVC short-wave ultraviolet light or SWUV 254 nm to assist gem identification of specimens.

There are a number of UV lights available now whether LED or fluorescent tubes. The quality of the UV light generated varies considerably, with the more expensive one using filters to remove most of the visible light and narrowing down the band of UV light emitted.

Results are quite variable as it depends on the UV source and impurities in the specimen that will restrict or stop a mineral from fluorescing (Fe – Iron is a suppressor).

We will look at this more closely in another article.



HABIT:

The characteristic shape of a mineral crystal or crystal aggregate. Habit can be described by the predominant crystal form e.g. prismatic, octahedral.

Crystal habit and form – Will be discussed under the crystallography article.

REFRACTIVE INDEX (RI):

Is a diagnostic feature of a mineral. Each mineral has a its own RI value and is dependant on the optical properties of that mineral or gemstone. There are a number of methods that can be used to determine the RI of a mineral/gemstone, most but not all methods require you to have a transparent to translucent specimen. With a gemmology refractometer faceted and cabochons gemstones can be tested but never use crystals or rough minerals as they can scratch the refractometer's glass/CZ prism. There are also digital refractometers available but they vary greatly in price and performance.

We will look at RI more closely in another article.

STREAK:

Not to be done on gem material or crystal specimens as this is a destructive test. If you must perform a streak test make sure you do it on an area that cannot be seen, if you can't, then don't do it.

Use an unglazed tile (hematite - jewellers' Rouge, magnetite, galena)

COLLECTION

Part of the enjoyment of mineralogy and Gemmology it starting your own collection. It is advisable to catalogue your collection as you acquire specimens and note down the specimen's name, location, cost, where and whom you acquired/purchased it from. Whether you use an Excel spreadsheet, dedicated data base or design your own (MS Access Libreoffice Base), note book, free or commercial col-

lecting software, you will thank yourself later if you do this right the first time. It should be noted that most data bases and collection software alow you to import or export information vis spreadsheets. Whether Storing and displaying your specimens:

You should be consistent i.e. all quartz together, fossil together or alphabetical for each group or just alphabetical.



In museums and textbook (some collectors also), specimens are stored and or displayed in chemical groups.
